Sharing a Meal at The Lighthouse: A New Program!

The Lighthouse food bank is now serving a healthy and nutritious lunch during food bank hours. Thanks to Daniel and Juliet, students from George Brown's Augmented Education - Assistant Cook (Extended Training) Program!

In March, The Lighthouse was approached by Teresa Doell, Job Coach/Job Developer from George Brown's Augmented Education, to see if The Lighthouse would be open to hosting two students for 150 hours of work placement in the summer semester (May-August).

`"I used to work at Bloor & Bathurst managing the culinary kitchen and event space at Nella Cucina. I always saw The Lighthouse as a community space. Then, when Daniel's mother mentioned The Lighthouse as an organization that has helped out at their church in Scarborough, I looked into making contact to inquire about food serbased student vice placement opportunities."



The Assistance Cook (Extended Training) is a free and unique program that provides people who have a history of addiction and/or mental health issues with the opportunity to receive training and employment in the food service industry. The program is designed for students who see work as part of their recovery process. The goal of this program is to help people with barriers to training and employment take the first steps towards a job in Toronto's food industry. Augmented Education is a training and employment support model developed by George Brown College and the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health (CAMH). The Assistant Cook (Extended Training) program is one of two Augmented Education programs currently offered at George Brown College.

After meeting with Teresa, and the two potential students, Daniel and Juliet, The Lighthouse embarked on this new partnership opportunity as it meets the needs of food bank members and aligns with goals of the Neighbourhood ministry. According to Teresa,

"The work placement component functions to provide our students with industry experience. Each student is different with unique goals and offers many skills to an exciting food service environment. With regards to Daniel and Juliet they wanted to complete their placement hours with an organization that serves its community. They were each looking to apply and practise their culinary skills from George Brown College in a setting that allowed them to make a difference in the community. "

On Fridays, Daniel and Juliet begin by assisting with the general food bank preparation work, such as tidying the food bank space, stocking shelves, and sorting the leftover produce.

Collected water can also be used to wash cars, clean floors and even do laundry. Rain barrels also provide water conservation opportunities, particularly during the dry summer months and help divert water from the foundation of buildings.

These environmentally friendly products were once used to transport fruits and vegetables, but have been repurposed. Now they offer years of reliable service as rain barrels.
