A typical summer job would have allowed me to develop my current skills as well as gain new ones, but I also wanted the chance to serve the community. The Lighthouse was the perfect place to work as it would allow me to grow as a person, while making a difference to the lives of others. As a Summer Student Intern, I was able to see firsthand how The Lighthouse made a positive impact on those in the community. Serving underprivileged, refugee and immigrant communities was definitely an educational and eve-opening experience - I saw firsthand some of the struggles of those in need, as well as what is being done to help them. While working here, I saw many people from many walks of life walk through our front doors. Some were here for the food bank, some for the manicure and pedicure program, and others for something in between. The food bank was a particular favourite of mine, as it gave me an opportunity to serve the clients of The Lighthouse directly. Little gestures such as a "Thank you" were nice, but the most satisfying part of serving them was the knowledge that I helped make a difference in their lives. Furthermore, being able to partake in conversation with those that came in was a real treat. All in all, working at the Lighthouse was a great experience, and I would recommend volunteering or working here for anyone that is looking to serve an underprivileged community.

The Lighthouse also ran a Chinese Children's Summer Camp, hosted at Calvary Logos Baptist Church in Scarborough. A lot of effort had gone into preparing for this camp in hopes of giving the campers the best experience possible. The camp ran every Tuesday and Wednesday from July 9th-31st, and had 44 children registered. A typical day started in worship, with children singing songs that glorified the Lord. They particularly enjoyed songs with many actions, such as "Father Abraham". Following worship was a

message (children's sermon) from the speaker. The campers were all very attentive, and learned a lot about Jesus through parables, bible verses and various interactions. The children were also given the opportunity to take part in "Spiritual Counseling", where they dived deeper into Christianity and were asked if they accepted Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour. By the end of the camp, a total of 13 boys and girls had accepted Christ!

Each summer, The Lighthouse hosts a family camp for Hispanic moms and kids. The logo for the camp consists of three ants carrying a banana, symbolizing our main theme: "We are Stronger Together." There have been many participants each year some new and some old. We strive to create a family-like atmosphere, and are blessed to be able to do so.

A key factor for the camp's success is The Lighthouse's volunteer training program. Leadership training for volunteers commences a month in advance of the camp. During this training, volunteers are taught the skills needed to operate certain of the camp programs and are provided with information essential for working with families.



Our volunteers also bring their own creativity, ideas and assets to our camp. Without the numbers and capabilities of our volunteers, it would be very difficult for The Light-house to continue to run the Hispanic family camp each year.



Patricia had been attending the camp with her children as a participant for the last two years, and this year she decided she would like to join our volunteer team. "I used to be a participant in the camp, and I really enjoyed coming! I felt really good about what I did and learned at the camp. I really felt like I was part of a larger family. I wanted to give back, and so I decided to attend camp as a volunteer this year."

Patricia was specifically involved in assisting as a team leader for the children's art therapy program, a unique component of the Hispanic family camp that encourages expression in art as a means of dealing with some of the stress experienced by children newly arrived to Canada. "For me, working with the kids, helping them with their art and talking with them was such a rewarding experience. Not only did I feel appreciated and connected to the kids, but I felt like I was making an impact on their lives. I really enjoyed our group."

Here at The Lighthouse, we seek to make our programs beneficial for all involved. Like Patricia, many of the women who volunteer had previously been participants in the family camp and had benefitted from its programs. It gives us much joy when so many who have taken part in our programs and have overcome hardships are enabled and inspired to give back and help others!


