I enjoy reflecting on scriptures to guide me through life. Currently, I have grown quite fond of Philippians 4:6-7 (NLT), which reads,





Yes, and I have made a lot of good friends over the years.


Tell me about a favorite memory that you've had with the group this year.

I would give them a warm welcome and let them know that they will feel as though they are going to be joining a family.










The Lighthouse's Student Placement Program

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
