


## Summer Student Experiences: Madi & Lian



This summer, The Lighthouse had not one, but two summer students to assist with our food bank, the Hispanic Seniors Group, as well as both the Hispanic and Vietnamese Children's Camps. Below Madi and Lian share their experiences from their time at The Lighthouse.

Madi—When I started at The Lighthouse I was excited for the opportunity to be involved in both the summer camps and the food bank, I was pleasantly surprised to have so many different experiences and freedom to direct my own learning. I was sure that I would feel more comfortable working in the summer camps, however, I found that the food bank proved to be very suited to my skills and the summer camps challenged me to take more of a leadership role, which was new for me. I feel a lot more comfortable working with kids and better equipped to facilitate groups.

I am currently completing my BSW and the Lighthouse has taught me many valuable skills for my future role as a social worker. I have been able to see and feel how helping through God, coming from a place of love for your fellow man, makes such a difference in the way we interact with one another, it helps make the relationship between helper and helpee feel less transactional. My past experience working in private practice made me want to get more involved in community based organizations, and I feel like my interactions with people are a lot more meaningful and authentic in a place like The Lighthouse which puts the people first.

Through my work I have learned a lot about the strengths that I bring to a team and some areas of growth which I can explore in my future practice. I have found that my time here has made me more connected to the community and experienced working holistically to meet the unique needs of the individuals within that community.

**Lian**– When I applied to The Lighthouse I was eager to work with others and to serve the community and provide for those in need. I was able to meet those goals through helping others at the food bank and preparing Bible lessons for the Vietnamese summer camp.

During my time here I learned many things like how to work with youths, how to be more selfless towards people and not expect anything in return. This experience also taught me to be more patient with others, like those who make extra requests to satisfy their needs at the food bank, and being around the energetic kids in both summer camps. I feel I have grown closer to God through sharing His Word with the kids and I am humbled to have acted in His name.


#### What is a Lighthouse Champion?
